4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 797 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 797. WILDFIRE PREVENTION
8	Sec. 797.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Director" means the director of the Texas A&M
10	Forest Service.
11	(2) "Wildfire" and "wildland" have the meanings
12	assigned by Section 88.1015, Education Code.
13	(3) "Wildland-urban interface" means a place where an
14	urban area and wildland meet and that:
15	(A) is designated by the director to be an
16	at-risk area for wildfires;
17	(B) is an area within one-half mile of a place
18	described by Paragraph (A); or
19	(C) is located in a county with an outdoor burn
20	ban in effect for at least 100 days during the past two years.
21	Sec. 797.002. FIRE HYDRANT REQUIREMENTS FOR WILDLAND-URBAN
22	INTERFACE. (a) This section applies only to a municipality with a
23	population of 2,500 or more that has within its boundaries a
24	wildland-urban interface.

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(b) A governing body of a municipality may by ordinance
 require a fire hydrant located in that municipality to conform to
 flow and pressure standards established by the ordinance.

4 (c) A municipality may consult with county and state fire
5 prevention agencies in adopting standards under Subsection (b).

6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
