A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a requirement that members of the Public Safety
- 3 Commission hold a secret security clearance.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subsection (b), Section 411.003, Government
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The commission is composed of five citizens of this
- 8 state appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the
- 9 senate. Members must be selected because of their peculiar
- 10 qualifications for the position and must reflect the diverse
- 11 geographic regions and population groups of this state. Members
- 12 must have and maintain a secret security clearance granted by the
- 13 United States government. A member may serve on the commission upon
- 14 the granting of an interim secret security clearance, but may not be
- 15 given access to classified information, participate in a briefing
- 16 involving classified information, or vote on an issue involving
- 17 classified information until a secret security clearance has been
- 18 finally approved by the United States government. Appointments to
- 19 the commission shall be made without regard to race, color,
- 20 disability, sex, religion, age, or national origin. In making an
- 21 appointment the governor shall consider, among other things, the
- 22 person's knowledge of laws, experience in the enforcement of law,
- 23 honesty, integrity, education, training, and executive ability.
- 24 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a

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- 1 member of the Public Safety Commission serving on or after the
- 2 effective date of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
