1-16 WHEREAS, Texas offers numerous opportunities for residents 1-17 and visitors to take part in water-related recreation; and 1-18 WHEREAS, While the benefits of such activities are many, it

1-18 WHEREAS, While the benefits of such activities are many, it 1-19 is vitally important that proper measures be taken to avoid 1-20 accidents; whether individuals are enjoying lakes, rivers, the Gulf 1-21 of Mexico, or a public or private pool, water safety is essential to 1-22 preventing drowning and injuries; and 1-23 WHEREAS, Each year, more than 100 Texas children die from

1-22 preventing drowning and injuries; and 1-23 WHEREAS, Each year, more than 100 Texas children die from 1-24 drowning, making it one of the leading causes of childhood injury 1-25 deaths; moreover, the rates of drowning-related deaths in the state 1-26 are consistently higher than the national average; and

1-27 WHEREAS, Studies of seasonal variations have shown that 1-28 two-thirds of the drowning deaths of young children and adolescents 1-29 occur in the months of May through August; raising awareness of this 1-30 issue in advance of the summer months will encourage the citizens of 1-31 the Lone Star State to exercise caution and will help reinforce the 1-32 message that water safety is everyone's responsibility; now, 1-33 therefore, be it

1-34 RESOLVED, That the 83rd Legislature of the State of Texas 1-35 hereby designate April as Water Safety Month; and, be it further
