1 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 2 proposing a constitutional amendment limiting to two the number of
- 3 consecutive terms for which a person may be elected or appointed to
- 4 hold certain state offices.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Article IV, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 7 adding Section 2a to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 2a. (a) A person who has been elected or appointed to
- 9 serve two consecutive terms in an office listed in Section 1 of this
- 10 article or any other state office normally filled by the voters at a
- 11 statewide election, other than a statewide judicial office, is not
- 12 eligible for election or appointment to serve a third consecutive
- 13 term. This provision does not limit a person's eligibility for
- 14 election or appointment to serve nonconsecutive terms.
- 15 (b) Nothing in this section prohibits a person from
- 16 continuing to serve in an office covered by this section after the
- 17 end of a term as a holdover under Section 17, Article XVI, of this
- 18 constitution until a successor is qualified.
- (c) The term of a person appointed to serve for the
- 20 remainder of a term to fill a vacancy in a statewide office is not
- 21 counted in determining whether a person is eligible to serve under
- 22 Subsection (a) of this section.
- 23 SECTION 2. The following temporary provision is added to
- 24 the Texas Constitution:

- 1 TEMPORARY PROVISION. (a) This temporary provision applies
- 2 to the constitutional amendment proposed by the 83rd Legislature,
- 3 Regular Session, 2013, limiting to two the number of consecutive
- 4 terms for which a person may be elected or appointed to hold certain
- 5 <u>state of</u>fices.
- 6 (b) A term of office that begins before January 1, 2014, is
- 7 not counted in determining whether a person is eligible to serve
- 8 under Section 2a, Article IV, of this constitution.
- 9 (c) This temporary provision expires February 1, 2031.
- 10 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 11 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 5, 2013.
- 12 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 13 proposition: "The constitutional amendment limiting to two the
- 14 number of consecutive terms for which a person may be elected or
- 15 appointed to hold the office of governor, lieutenant governor,
- 16 secretary of state, comptroller of public accounts, commissioner of
- 17 the General Land Office, attorney general, commissioner of
- 18 agriculture, or railroad commissioner."
