WHEREAS, In spite of a diagnosis of scleroderma/systemic sclerosis, she maintained an active life and was a leader in the Fort Worth community; she served on the board of directors of the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra, and she was also active in the Fort Worth Opera Guild and the Woman's Club of Fort Worth for many years; and

WHEREAS, Jeanette gave unselfishly of her time to others and to numerous charitable organizations, and her courage in the face of her illness was an inspiration to all who knew her; and

WHEREAS, Jeanette Bunting was respected for her many accomplishments and was beloved by many, and she will long be remembered with affection and appreciation by all who were privileged to share in her life; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the State of Texas, 83rd Legislature, hereby extend sincere condolences to the bereaved family of Carolyn Jeanette Covington Bunting; and, be it further
