WHEREAS, Hector "El Pipo" Barragan is highly deserving of recognition and praise for his many years as an entrepreneur and cultural figure in El Paso; his passion and dedication to promoting arts as diverse as hair dressing and bullfighting have made him a unique character in the city; now, therefore, be it
