WHEREAS, The Senate of the State of Texas takes pleasure in recognizing the Fort Worth Office of Emergency Management and its director, Juan Ortiz, for their efforts in the implementation of the Fort Worth Accessible Hazard Alert System; and

WHEREAS, This potentially lifesaving protocol will convey vital information to Internet-linked and video-capable devices such as computers, cellular telephones, and wireless Braille readers; and

WHEREAS, By establishing this innovative program, the city becomes a pioneer in creating accessible emergency services; Fort Worth is one of only a few cities nationwide that have implemented such an alert system; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That the Senate of the State of Texas, 83rd
