WHEREAS, Among his many interests were traveling, skiing, and gardening; he was married to his wife, Sarabeth, for 25 years, and he was very proud that his son, Hans Peter, decided to continue the family legacy by taking over the pastry shop; and

WHEREAS, A man of wisdom, strength, and compassion, he gave unselfishly to others, and his generous spirit, his gentle manner, and his enthusiasm for living each day to the fullest will not be forgotten; and

WHEREAS, He was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather, and he leaves behind memories that will be treasured forever by his family and many friends; now, therefore, be it
