WHEREAS, Mr. Bland also serves as president of the Coalition of Black Trade Unionists and as vice president of the Texas American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations; he has been active in politics as a precinct judge, as Senate District 13 chair, and as a representative on the Houston Police Department's Citizens Review Committee; and
