WHEREAS, Mrs. Brinck began a long and fulfilling career as a school teacher in 1967 in Kennedale and retired from James F. Delaney Primary School after 30 years of exemplary service; she was active in community and professional affairs and was a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma Sorority, the Baylor Alumni Association, and the Texas Retired Teachers Association; and

WHEREAS, She was known for her beautiful voice and often sang solo in churches and for radio stations and special events; and

WHEREAS, A woman of courage, strength, and dignity, she gave generously to others, and her wisdom, warmth, and valued counsel will not be forgotten by those who knew her; and
