WHEREAS, A graduate of Bishop College, Mr. Wyatt has been actively involved in the Austin community for more than 40 years; he was a founding member of the Capital City Chamber of Commerce and was the first African American to join the Austin Jaycees; he has served as president of the Austin Centex Chapter of the National Business League and was a member of the city's Private Industry Council; he currently sits on the board of the Retired Senior Volunteer Program; and

WHEREAS, The Villager newspaper has been a mainstay in Austin's African American community since its inception and has experienced continuous growth in the Austin market; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the State of Texas, 83rd Legislature, hereby commend T. L. Wyatt on his contributions to the community as publisher and editor of the *Villager* newspaper and extend best wishes to all associated with the newspaper, for a memorable 40th anniversary celebration; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be prepared for the newspaper as an expression of esteem from the Texas Senate.
