WHEREAS, Mr. Viramontes was the first basketball coach at McCallum High School, where he also taught science; he became an educational administrator and served as a vice principal at Porter and Kealing Junior High Schools; he was a longtime successful head principal at Reagan High School until his retirement in 1990; and
