IN RE: HB807 by Zerwas (Relating to the practice of psychology; authorizing a fee.), Committee Report 1st House, Substituted

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Occupations Code relating to the practice of psychology.

Based on the information provided by the Board of Psychologists, Department of Aging & Disability Services, Texas Juvenile Justice Department, and the Department of State Health Services, this analysis assumes that duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.
