IN RE: SB328 by Carona (relating to entrepreneurs-in-residence at state agencies), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

<p>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</p>

The bill would amend the Government Code, Chapter 651 to permit state agencies to hire entrepreneurs-in-residence to improve outreach with the private sector and implement private sector best practices within state government. A sample of agencies including the Department of Information Resources, the University of Texas System and Texas A&M University System indicate that any costs associated with the bill could be absorbed within each agency's existing resources.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
