IN RE: SB914 by Lucio (Relating to a behavior improvement plan or a behavioral intervention plan adopted for certain students with an individualized education program.), **Committee Report 2nd House, Substituted**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would to allow an admission, review, and dismissal (ARD) committee to determine if a behavior improvement plan or a behavioral intervention plan is appropriate for a student with an individualized education program (IEP). If the ARD committee determined it was appropriate, the behavior improvement plan or behavioral intervention plan would be incorporated into the student's IEP and provided to each of the student's teachers.

Based on the analysis of the Texas Education Agency (TEA), required revisions to the model IEP could be accomplished with existing agency resources.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
