**IN RE:** SB1192 by Davis (Relating to the rights of certain victims of sexual assault.), As  
**Introduced**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

In cases involving sexual assault, the victim, the guardian of a victim, or a close relative of a deceased victim would be entitled to the right to: request information regarding evidence and the status of the analysis of evidence; notification of when evidence is being analyzed, the results, and when the DNA profile of a suspect is provided to a state or federal DNA database; and AIDS and HIV counseling and testing as well as a forensic medical examination. The bill would also provide for the notification of the victim of the rights described by the bill.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
