Relating to the authority of public defenders to refuse to accept indigent defense appointments for good cause.

HB 1670 Carter
Relating to the addition of a synthetic hallucinogenic substance to Penalty Group 2 of the Texas Controlled Substances Act.

HB 1671 Carter
Relating to the designation of certain synthetic cannabinoids as controlled substances and controlled substance analogues under the Texas Controlled Substances Act.

HB 3773 Coleman
Relating to the use of deadly force in defense of a person or residence.

HB 3747 Farrar
Relating to a central database containing information about certain persons who have been convicted of or received a grant of deferred adjudication for certain offenses involving animal cruelty; providing a criminal penalty.

Relating to the repeal of the offense of homosexual conduct.

HB 1703 Farrar | et al.
Relating to abolishing the death penalty.

HB 530 Fletcher
Relating to interception of wire, oral, or electronic communications for law enforcement purposes.

Relating to the prosecution of and consequences for certain acts of official oppression; providing penalties.

HB 574 Lozano
Relating to the punishment prescribed for the offense of bail jumping and failure to appear.

HB 2573 McClendon
Relating to making certain incompetency proceedings available for proceedings held to revoke community supervision granted to a defendant in a criminal case.

HB 1333 Perry | et al.
Relating to the designation of certain synthetic compounds to Penalty Group 2 or 2-A of the Texas Controlled Substances Act.

HB 720 Price | et al.
Relating to enhancing the penalty for intoxication manslaughter and intoxication assault in certain circumstances.

HB 933 Turner, Sylvester
Relating to automatic expunction of a juvenile's record after completion of a deferred prosecution program; providing a criminal penalty.

HB 1498 Flynn
Relating to the offense of money laundering.

HB 235 Riddle
Relating to the punishment prescribed for burglary of a vehicle and to grants of community supervision to persons who commit that offense.

HB 1631 Fletcher
Relating to the circumstances under which a final judgment of bond forfeiture may be reformed under a special bill of review.

HB 140 Raymond
Relating to the punishment for the offense of manslaughter.

HB 3727 Raymond
Relating to the fees collected by prosecutors for collection and processing of certain checks or similar sight orders; authorizing an increase in fees.

SB 992 Taylor
Relating to misrepresentations in connection with certain drug testing devices or equipment; providing penalties.
