Relating to the qualifications for appointment as a medical examiner.

Relating to the notification of a potential predator for civil commitment

**SB 864** Campbell  
Relating to a handgun proficiency course that is taken to obtain or renew a concealed handgun license.

**SB 970** Huffman  
Relating to the execution of a search warrant for taking a DNA specimen.

**SB 1173** West  
Relating to procedures for the sentencing and placement on community supervision of defendants charged with the commission of a state jail felony.

**SB 1234** Whitmire  
Relating to the establishment of progressive sanctions for students who fail to attend school and to the repeal of the offenses of failure to attend school and parent contributing to nonattendance.

**SB 1475** Duncan  
Relating to the development and use of a jail-based restoration of competency pilot program.
