H.B. No. 1122

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to a pilot program for a three-year high school diploma  
3 plan and cost-neutral expansion of full-day prekindergarten  
4 programs.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 28, Education Code, is  
7 amended by adding Section 28.0255 to read as follows:

8 Sec. 28.0255. PILOT PROGRAM: THREE-YEAR HIGH SCHOOL  
9 DIPLOMA PLAN. (a) In this section, "certificate program," "public  
10 junior college," "public state college," and "public technical  
11 institute" have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003.

12 (b) This section applies only to a school district:

13 (1) with an enrollment of more than 150,000 students;

14 and

15 (2) located primarily in a county that has a  
16 population of 2.2 million or more and that is adjacent to a county  
17 with a population of more than 600,000.

18 (c) A school district to which this section applies may  
19 develop and implement a pilot program for students who wish to  
20 obtain a high school diploma after completion of three years of  
21 secondary school attendance as an alternative to the traditional  
22 four-year period of attendance. The program must:

23 (1) be designed to serve the educational needs of  
24 students who do not anticipate immediate enrollment in a four-year

1 college or university after graduation from high school; and

2 (2) include partnerships between the school district  
3 and public junior colleges, public technical institutes, public  
4 state colleges, and any other public postsecondary institutions in  
5 this state offering academic or technical education or vocational  
6 training under a certificate program or an associate degree program  
7 to facilitate the prompt enrollment of students in those  
8 institutions after high school graduation under the program.

9 (d) Participation by a student in the program must be  
10 voluntary, with approval of the student's parent. A student who  
11 agrees to participate in the program may, on request, discontinue  
12 participation and resume taking courses under a high school program  
13 based on a traditional four-year period of attendance.

14 (e) Notwithstanding Section 28.025, the school district  
15 shall specify the curriculum requirements for receiving a high  
16 school diploma under the program. The curriculum requirements must  
17 ensure that a student who graduates under the program possesses  
18 sufficient knowledge and skills in English language arts and  
19 mathematics to be capable of performing successfully in public  
20 junior college-level courses.

21 (f) The school district shall submit the proposed  
22 curriculum requirements to the State Board of Education for comment  
23 and the commissioner for approval. The district may not implement  
24 the program before obtaining the commissioner's approval of the  
25 proposed curriculum requirements.

26 (g) A student is entitled to a high school diploma if the  
27 student:

1           (1) successfully complies with the curriculum  
2 requirements specified under Subsection (e); and

3           (2) performs satisfactorily, as determined by the  
4 commissioner under Subsection (h), on end-of-course assessment  
5 instruments listed under Section 39.023(c) for courses in which the  
6 student was enrolled.

7           (h) For purposes of Subsection (g)(2), the commissioner  
8 shall determine the level of satisfactory performance on applicable  
9 end-of-course assessment instruments administered to a student.

10           (i) The school district shall report the academic  
11 achievement record of students who have completed the program on a  
12 transcript that clearly identifies the program and distinguishes  
13 the program from the other high school programs based on a  
14 traditional four-year period of attendance.

15           (j) A student who has received a diploma under the program  
16 is exempt from the compulsory school attendance requirements under  
17 Section 25.085.

18           (k) To the extent this section conflicts with any other  
19 provision of this code or rule adopted under this code, this section  
20 prevails.

21           (l) This section expires September 1, 2023.

22           SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 42, Education Code, is  
23 amended by adding Section 42.2526 to read as follows:

24           Sec. 42.2526. ADJUSTMENT FOR DISTRICT OPERATING PILOT  
25 PROGRAM. (a) This section applies only to a school district  
26 operating a pilot program authorized by Section 28.0255.

27           (b) Beginning with the first school year that follows the

1 first school year in which students receive high school diplomas  
2 under the pilot program authorized by Section 28.0255 and  
3 continuing for every subsequent school year that the district  
4 operates the pilot program, the commissioner shall provide funding  
5 for the district's prekindergarten program under Section 29.153 on  
6 a full-day basis for a number of prekindergarten students equal to  
7 twice the number of students who received a high school diploma  
8 under the pilot program authorized by Section 28.0255 during the  
9 preceding school year.

10 (c) This section expires September 1, 2023.

11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

2 (1) In SECTION 1 of the bill, in added Section 28.0255(c),  
3 Education Code (page 1, line 39), strike the colon.

4 (2) In SECTION 1 of the bill, strike added Section  
5 28.0255(c)(1), Education Code (page 1, lines 40-42).

6 (3) In SECTION 1 of the bill, in added Section  
7 28.0255(c)(2), Education Code (page 1, line 43), strike "(2)".

8 (4) In SECTION 1 of the bill, strike added Section  
9 28.0255(f), Education Code (page 2, lines 1-5), and substitute the  
10 following:

11 (f) The school district shall submit to the commissioner for  
12 approval the district's proposal regarding the scope of the program  
13 and the program curriculum requirements. The school district shall  
14 also submit the proposed curriculum requirements to the State Board  
15 of Education for comment. The district may not implement the  
16 program before obtaining the commissioner's approval of the scope  
17 of the program and the program curriculum requirements.

<b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b>
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The bill would allow the Dallas Independent School District (ISD) to establish a pilot program through which students could earn a high school diploma in three years, pursuant to the provisions of the bill. The bill would direct that the entitlement that would have been earned under the Foundation School Program (FSP) if students participating in the pilot program had attended school for the fourth year would be redirected for the purpose of providing a full-day prekindergarten program in Dallas ISD in the year subsequent to the students' graduation under the three-year program. The pilot program would expire at the end of FY2023.

Costs associated with implementing the program are not estimated to be significant.

**Local Government Impact**

Dallas ISD would be permitted to establish a pilot three-year high school diploma plan and have FSP funds associated with participants' fourth year of high school redirected to support full-day prekindergarten.
