#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to increases in the records archive fees and the records management and preservation fees charged by district and county 3 clerks. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 51.305(b), Government Code, is amended 6 to read as follows: 7 (b) The commissioners court of a county may adopt a district 8 court records archive fee of not more than \$10 [ $\frac{5}{5}$ ] for the filing 9 of a suit, including an appeal from an inferior court, or a 10 11 cross-action, counterclaim, intervention, contempt action, motion 12 for new trial, or third-party petition, in a district court in the county as part of the county's annual budget. 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SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
