4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 461.009, Transportation Code, is amended
6	by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
7	(c) At the request of an individual who resides in a
8	provider's service area and is eligible to use the provider's
9	services, the provider shall provide written certification that the
10	individual is eligible to use the provider's services. Proof of
11	certification made under this subsection entitles the individual to
12	obtain services from any provider in the state for not more than 60
13	days during a 365-day period that begins with the individual's
14	first use of a provider's service outside of the service area in
15	which the individual resides.
16	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
17	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
18	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
19	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

20 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
