7	SECTION 1. Section 13.004(c), Election Code, is amended to
8	read as follows:

10	application is confidential and does not constitute public
11	information for purposes of Chapter 552, Government Code:

13	(2) a Texas driver's license number;
14	(3) a number of a personal identification card issued
15	by the Department of Public Safety;
16	(4) an indication that an applicant is interested in
17	working as an election judge; or
18	(5) the residence address of the applicant, if the
19	applicant is a federal judge or state judge, as defined by Section
20	13.0021, [or] the spouse of a federal judge or state judge, <u>or an</u>
21	individual to whom Section 552.1175, Government Code, applies and
22	the applicant:

SECTION 2. The heading to Section 552.1175, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 552.1175. CONFIDENTIALITY OF <u>CERTAIN IDENTIFYING</u>
 [ADDRESSES, TELEPHONE NUMBERS, SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS, AND
 PERSONAL FAMILY] INFORMATION OF PEACE OFFICERS, COUNTY JAILERS,
 SECURITY OFFICERS, AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF
 CRIMINAL JUSTICE OR A PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE.

SECTION 3. Sections 552.1175(b) and (e), Government Code, are amended to read as follows:

(b) Information that relates to the home address, home telephone number, emergency contact information, <u>date of birth</u>, or social security number of an individual to whom this section applies, or that reveals whether the individual has family members is confidential and may not be disclosed to the public under this chapter if the individual to whom the information relates:

27 (1) chooses to restrict public access to the

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1 information; and

2 (2) notifies the governmental body of the individual's
3 choice on a form provided by the governmental body, accompanied by
4 evidence of the individual's status.

5 (e) All documents filed with a county clerk and all 6 documents filed with a district clerk are exempt from this section, except that the county clerk or district clerk may redact the street 7 address of an individual to whom this section applies from a 8 document filed with the clerk without the necessity of requesting a 9 decision from the attorney general under Subchapter G at the 10 request of the individual, if that individual identifies to the 11 12 clerk the specific document containing the address.

13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

20 SECTION 3. Sections 552.1175(a) and (b), Government Code, 21 are amended to read as follows:

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(a) This section applies only to:

(1) peace officers as defined by Article 2.12, Code of
 Criminal Procedure;

(2) county jailers as defined by Section 1701.001,
 Occupations Code;

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(3) current or former employees of the Texas

Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of
 the department or any division of the department;
