The board shall, after 3 consulting with appropriate higher education faculty and public 4 5 school teachers and administrators and soliciting advice from other interested persons with relevant knowledge and experience, develop 6 7 and carry out a process for reviewing and, as necessary, updating standards and requirements for educator preparation and 8 alternative certification programs. 9

10 SECTION 3. The State Board for Educator Certification shall 11 complete an initial review of and implement any updated standards 12 and requirements for educator preparation and alternative 13 certification programs as required by Section 21.061, Education 14 Code, as added by this Act, not later than September 1, 2014.

15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

The commissioner shall determine the satisfactory level of performance required 5 for each certification examination. For the issuance of a 6 generalist certificate, the commissioner shall require a 7 satisfactory level of examination performance in each core 8 9 subject covered by the examination.

Sec. 21.061. REVIEW AND UPDATING OF EDUCATOR PREPARATION PROGRAMS. The board shall, after consulting with appropriate higher education faculty and public school teachers and administrators and soliciting advice from other interested persons with relevant knowledge and experience, develop and carry out a process for reviewing and, as necessary, updating standards and requirements for educator preparation programs.

19 SECTION 4. The State Board for Educator Certification 20 shall complete an initial review of and implement any updated 21 standards and requirements for educator preparation and 22 alternative certification programs as required by Section 23 21.061, Education Code, as added by this Act, not later than 24 September 1, 2014.

25 SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2014, the commissioner 26 of education shall determine performance levels for 27 certification examinations as provided by Section 21.048(a),

2 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it 3 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 4 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 5 Constitution.
