- 7 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission,

- 10 recommendations of the task force; and
- 11 (2) a description of the activities of the task force.
- 12 Sec. 32.065. EXPIRATION. The task force is abolished and
- 13 this subchapter expires January 1, 2016.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
