1 SECTION 2. Section 1951.103(b), Occupations Code, is 2 amended to read as follows:

(b) A person may not be a member of the committee if:

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4 (1) the person is an officer, employee, or paid
5 consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of pest control
6 except as provided by Section <u>1951.101(a)(2)</u> [<u>1951.101(a)(4)</u>]; or

7 (2) the person's spouse is an officer, manager, or paid 8 consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of pest 9 control.

10 SECTION 3. Section 1951.101(c), Occupations Code, is 11 repealed.

12 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act in the qualifications of members of the structural pest control advisory 13 14 committee do not affect the entitlement of a member serving on the 15 committee immediately before the effective date of this Act to continue to serve for the remainder of the member's term. As the 16 17 terms of committee members expire, the commissioner of agriculture shall appoint or reappoint a member who has the qualifications 18 19 required for a member under Section 1951.101(a), Occupations Code, as amended by this Act. 20

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

6 SECTION 2. (a) On September 1, 2013, the terms of the 7 members of the structural pest control advisory committee appointed 8 under former Section 1951.101(a)(1), Occupations Code, expire.

(b) Not later than October 1, 2013, the commissioner of 9 agriculture shall appoint the new members of the structural pest 10 control advisory committee necessary to ensure that the composition 11 of the committee complies with Section 1951.101, Occupations Code, 12 as amended by this Act, and designate the terms of those members to 13 expire on February 1, 2015, or February 1, 2017, as appropriate, to 14 ensure that the expiration of the terms complies with Section 15 16 1951.101(b), Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
