SECTION 1. Section 53.021(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A licensing authority may suspend or revoke a license, disqualify a person from receiving a license, or deny to a person the opportunity to take a licensing examination on the grounds that the person has been convicted of <u>an offense</u>, <u>other than an offense punishable as a Class C misdemeanor</u>, <u>that</u>:

(1) [an offense that] directly relates to the duties and responsibilities of the licensed occupation;

(2) [an offense that] does not directly relate to the duties and responsibilities of the licensed occupation and that was committed less than five years before the date the person applies for the license;

(3) <u>is</u> [an offense] listed in Section 3g, Article 42.12, Code of Criminal Procedure; or

(4) <u>is</u> a sexually violent offense, as defined by Article 62.001, Code of Criminal Procedure.

SECTION 1. Section 53.021, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
(a-1) Subsection (a) does not apply to a person who has been convicted only of an offense punishable as a Class C misdemeanor unless:
(1) the person is an applicant for or the holder of a license that authorizes the person to possess a firearm; and
(2) the offense for which the person was convicted is a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence as that term is defined by 18 U.S.C. Section 921.
