Amend CSHB 3474 (senate committee report) as follows:

(1) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and renumber subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly: SECTION _____. Effective September 1, 2015, the heading to

Chapter 614, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: CHAPTER 614. <u>LAW ENFORCEMENT</u> [PEACE] OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS

SECTION ____. Effective September 1, 2015, Subchapter D, Chapter 614, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER D. PURCHASE OF [AGENCY-ISSUED] FIREARM OF HONORABLY

RETIRED OR DECEASED PEACE OFFICER OR COUNTY JAILER

Sec. 614.0505. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:

(1) "County jailer" has the meaning assigned by Section 1701.001, Occupations Code.

(2) "Governmental entity" means a state agency, a county, or a municipality.

Sec. 614.051. PURCHASE OF FIREARM BY HONORABLY RETIRED PEACE OFFICER <u>OR COUNTY JAILER</u>. (a) An individual may purchase a firearm from a <u>governmental entity</u> [state agency] if:

(1) the individual was a peace officer commissioned by or a county jailer employed by the entity [agency];

(2) the individual was honorably retired from the individual's commission <u>or employment</u> by the <u>entity</u> [state];

(3) the firearm had been previously issued to the individual by the <u>entity</u> [agency]; and

(4) the firearm is not a prohibited weapon underSection 46.05, Penal Code.

(b) An individual may purchase only one firearm from a governmental entity [state agency] under this section.

Sec. 614.052. PURCHASE OF FIREARM BY SURVIVING SPOUSE, CHILD, OR PARENT OF DECEASED PEACE OFFICER <u>OR COUNTY JAILER</u>. (a) An individual listed under Subsection (b) may purchase a firearm from a <u>governmental entity</u> [state agency] if:

(1) the firearm had been previously issued by the <u>entity</u> [agency] to a peace officer commissioned by <u>or a county</u> jailer employed by the <u>entity</u> [agency] who died while commissioned <u>or employed</u>, without regard to whether the <u>peace</u> officer <u>or county</u> jailer died while discharging the officer's <u>or jailer's</u> official

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duties; and

(2) the firearm is not a prohibited weapon underSection 46.05, Penal Code.

(b) Individuals who may purchase the firearm under Subsection (a) are, in order of precedence:

(1) the surviving spouse of the deceased peace officeror county jailer;

(2) a child of the deceased peace officer <u>or county</u> jailer; and

(3) a parent of the deceased peace officer <u>or county</u> jailer.

Sec. 614.053. PURCHASE PRICE OF FIREARM. A <u>governmental</u> <u>entity</u> [state agency] shall establish the amount, which may not exceed fair market value, for which a firearm may be purchased under this subchapter.

Sec. 614.054. WHEN FIREARM MAY BE PURCHASED [FROM STATE AGENCY]; DELAY OF SALE BY <u>GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY</u> [AGENCY]. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), an individual must purchase a firearm under Section 614.051 before the second anniversary of the date of the person's retirement or under Section 614.052 before the second anniversary of the date of the [officer's] death <u>of the peace</u> officer or county jailer.

(b) A <u>governmental entity</u> [state agency] that cannot immediately replace the firearm may delay the sale of the firearm until the <u>entity</u> [agency] can replace the firearm.

(2) In SECTION 63 of the bill, in the repealer (page 22, line10), strike "and".

(3) In SECTION 63 of the bill, in the repealer (page 22, between lines 10 and 11), insert the following:

(4) Section 170.002, Local Government Code; and

(4) In SECTION 63 of the bill, in the repealer (page 22, line11), strike "(4)" and substitute "(5)".

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
