A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the consideration of the performance of students of limited English proficiency on state assessment instruments and 3 inclusion of related information in campus report cards. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 39.027(a-2), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 (a-2) Unless a student is enrolled in a school in the United 8 9 States for a period of at least 120 [60] consecutive days during a year, the student may not be considered to be enrolled in a school 10 11 in the United States for that year for the purpose of determining a number of years under Subsection (a)(1), (2), or (3). 12 SECTION 2. Section 39.054, Education Code, is amended by 13 14 adding Subsections (d-2) and (d-3) to read as follows:

(d-2) Except as provided by Subsection (d-3), in evaluating 15 performance under Subsection (c), the commissioner may not lower a 16 performance rating for purposes of this chapter based on 17 unsatisfactory performance on an assessment instrument 18 administered under Section 39.023(a), (b), (c), (l), or (n) to a 19 student for a period of two years after the student's initial 20 21 enrollment in a school in the United States if the student is a student of limited English proficiency, as defined by Section 22 23 29.052. This subsection does not apply to a performance rating for 24

- 1 (1) compliance monitoring under Section 7.028; or
- 2 (2) public school accountability under federal law.
- 3 (d-3) Subsection (d-2) does not apply if the assessment
- 4 instrument administered to a student of limited English proficiency
- 5 is in the student's native language.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 39.305(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (b) The report card shall include the following
- 9 information:
- 10 (1) where applicable, the student achievement
- 11 indicators described by Section 39.053(c) and the reporting
- 12 indicators described by Sections 39.301(c)(1) through (5);
- 13 (2) average class size by grade level and subject;
- 14 (3) the administrative and instructional costs per
- 15 student, computed in a manner consistent with Section 44.0071;
- 16 [and]
- 17 (4) the district's instructional expenditures ratio
- 18 and instructional employees ratio computed under Section 44.0071,
- 19 and the statewide average of those ratios, as determined by the
- 20 commissioner; and
- 21 (5) the performance of students of limited English
- 22 proficiency, as defined by Section 29.052, on assessment
- 23 <u>instruments administered under Section 39.023</u>.
- SECTION 4. Section 39.027(a-2), Education Code, as amended
- 25 by this Act, and Section 39.054(d-2), Education Code, as added by
- 26 this Act, apply to a student regardless of the date on which the
- 27 student initially enrolled in a school in the United States.

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1 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
