	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to a study of the Dallas Men Against Abuse program.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. STUDY REQUIRED. The Health and Human Services
5	Commission shall conduct a study of the Dallas Men Against Abuse
6	program implemented by the City of Dallas to address domestic
7	violence to determine if any or all aspects of the program should be
8	implemented at the state level or in additional local communities
9	or school districts.
10	SECTION 2. CONTENTS OF STUDY. The study must:
11	(1) examine each aspect of the program;
12	(2) evaluate the effectiveness of each aspect of the
13	program in reducing incidents of family violence, based on
14	indicators such as the number of calls made to domestic violence
15	hotlines, the number of victims of family violence who participate
16	in prosecution of offenses involving family violence, and the
17	number of aggravated assault charges filed in family violence
18	cases;
19	(3) assess the costs associated with the program and
20	sources of funding;
21	(4) determine the feasibility of implementing one or
22	more aspects of the program at the state level or in additional
23	local communities or school districts; and
24	(5) make recommendations to the legislature regarding

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1 implementation of any or all aspects of the program at the state
2 level or in additional local communities or school districts.

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SECTION 3. AGENCY PARTICIPATION AND COOPERATION. 3 At the request of the Health and Human Services Commission, the Department 4 of Family and Protective Services and each other health and human 5 services agency under the authority of the commission shall 6 participate in the study and provide appropriate assistance. 7 The Texas Education Agency shall cooperate with the Health and Human 8 Services Commission as necessary to enable the commission to assess 9 10 the feasibility of implementing any or all aspects of the program in school districts. 11

12 SECTION 4. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2016, the 13 Health and Human Services Commission shall submit a report to the 14 legislature regarding the results of the study and the commission's 15 recommendations regarding expanded implementation of the program.

16 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 17 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 18 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 19 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 20 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
