3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. STUDY REQUIRED. The Health and Human Services
5	Commission shall conduct a study of the Dallas Men Against Abuse

- 10 SECTION 2. CONTENTS OF STUDY. The study must:
- 11 (1) examine each aspect of the program;
- 12 (2) evaluate the effectiveness of each aspect of the
- 13 program in reducing incidents of family violence, based on
- 14 indicators such as the number of calls made to domestic violence
- 15 hotlines, the number of victims of family violence who participate
- 16 in prosecution of offenses involving family violence, and the
- 17 number of aggravated assault charges filed in family violence
- 18 cases;

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- 19 (3) assess the costs associated with the program and
- 20 sources of funding;
- 21 (4) determine the feasibility of implementing one or
- 22 more aspects of the program at the state level or in additional
- 23 local communities or school districts; and
- 24 (5) make recommendations to the legislature regarding

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- 1 implementation of any or all aspects of the program at the state
- 2 level or in additional local communities or school districts.
- 3 SECTION 3. AGENCY PARTICIPATION AND COOPERATION. At the
- 4 request of the Health and Human Services Commission, the Department
- 5 of Family and Protective Services and each other health and human
- 6 services agency under the authority of the commission shall
- 7 participate in the study and provide appropriate assistance. The
- 8 Texas Education Agency shall cooperate with the Health and Human
- 9 Services Commission as necessary to enable the commission to assess
- 10 the feasibility of implementing any or all aspects of the program in
- 11 school districts.
- 12 SECTION 4. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2016, the
- 13 Health and Human Services Commission shall submit a report to the
- 14 legislature regarding the results of the study and the commission's
- 15 recommendations regarding expanded implementation of the program.
- 16 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 17 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 18 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 19 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 20 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
