No. 77 By: Zaffirini 1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1-20 AN ACT relating to a study of the Dallas Men Against Abuse program and other activities in the Dallas community addressing family 1-21 1-22 1-23 violence. 1-24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 1-25 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act: "Commission" means the Health and Human Services 1-26 1-27 (1)Commission. 1-28 (2) "Program" means the Dallas Men Against Abuse 1-29 program implemented by the City of Dallas. 1-30 SECTION 2. STUDY REQUIRED. The Health and Human (a) Services Commission, in conjunction with a statewide coalition on family violence, shall conduct a study of activities in the Dallas 1-31 1**-**32 1-33 community addressing family violence, with a specific focus on each aspect of the Dallas Men Against Abuse program, to determine if any 1-34 1-35 or all of those activities or program aspects should be implemented 1-36 at the state level or in additional local communities or school 1-37 districts. CONTENTS OF STUDY.
