## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the criteria for awarding the Texas Purple Heart Medal to members of the armed forces wounded or killed at Fort Hood on 3 November 5, 2009. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 437.355(a), Government Code, is amended 7 to read as follows: The governor or adjutant general, if delegated the 8 (a) 9 authority, may adopt policies and regulations relating to awarding: (1) the Texas Purple Heart Medal, which shall be 10 11 awarded to a service member who: 12 (A) [7] after September 11, 2001: 13 (i) [<del>(A)</del>] was inducted into federal service from the Texas National Guard; and 14 15 (ii) [<del>(B)</del>] meets the criteria for an award 16 of the federal Purple Heart Medal; or 17 (B) was wounded or killed at Fort Hood on November 5, 2009; 18 (2) the Texas Superior Service Medal, which shall be 19 awarded to: 20 21 (A) a service member of the Texas military forces 22 who has: 23 (i) completed 30 or more years of honorable state service or a combination of state and federal service; and 24

1 (ii) continually demonstrated superior performance and service while assigned to key leadership positions 2 3 demanding responsibility; or 4 (B) a civilian who has contributed significant 5 service to the Texas military forces; (3) the Lone Star Distinguished Service Medal, which 6 7 shall be awarded to a member of the military forces of this state, 8 another state, or the United States for exceptionally outstanding achievement or service to this state in performance of a duty of 9 10 great responsibility while serving with the Texas military forces for whom the department receives a letter of recommendation for 11 award of the Lone Star Distinguished Service Medal that: 12 (A) 13 gives an account of the exceptional 14 achievement or service; and 15 (B) includes facts and photographs, and extracts from official documents to support and amplify the facts; 16 17 (4) the Texas Outstanding Service Medal, which shall be awarded to a service member of the military forces of this state, 18 19 another state, or the United States who has performed service in a superior and clearly outstanding manner; 20 21 the Texas Humanitarian Service Medal, which shall (5) be awarded to a service member who: 2.2 does not meet the criteria for an award of the 23 (A) 24 federal Humanitarian Service Medal; 25 (B) is a member of the Texas military forces; and 26 (C) while serving on state active duty or active 27 duty under state authority in accordance with Title 32, United

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States Code, participates satisfactorily in defense support to a
 mission under civilian authority to protect life or property during
 or soon after a natural disaster or civil unrest in the state;

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4 (6) the Texas Homeland Defense Service Medal, which
5 shall be awarded to a service member of the Texas military forces
6 who served:

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(A) on or after September 11, 2001;

8 (B) on state active duty or active duty under 9 state authority in accordance with Title 32, United States Code; 10 and

11 (C) satisfactorily in defense support to a 12 mission in the state under civilian authority;

13 (7) the Federal Service Medal, which shall be awarded 14 to a service member who was inducted into federal service from the 15 Texas military forces between June 15, 1940, and January 1, 1946, or 16 after June 1, 1950, if the service was for more than 90 days;

17 (8) the Texas Combat Service Ribbon, which shall be 18 awarded to a service member of the Texas National Guard who served, 19 after September 11, 2001, in a hostile fire zone as designated by 20 the United States secretary of defense;

(9) the Texas Faithful Service Medal, which shall be awarded to a member of the Texas military forces who has completed five years of honorable service during which the service member has shown fidelity to duty, efficient service, and great loyalty to this state;

(10) the Texas Medal of Merit, which shall be awarded
to a member of the military forces of this state, another state, or

1 the United States who performs outstanding service or attains 2 extraordinary achievement in behalf of the state or United States;

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3 (11) the Texas State Guard Service Medal, which shall 4 be awarded to a service member who completes three consecutive 5 years of honorable service in the Texas State Guard during which the 6 service member has shown fidelity to duty, efficient service, and 7 great loyalty to this state;

8 (12) the Texas Desert Shield/Desert Storm Campaign 9 Medal, which shall be awarded to a service member who was inducted 10 into federal service from the Texas National Guard after August 1, 11 1990, in support of Operation Desert Shield or Operation Desert 12 Storm, without regard to the place that the service member was 13 deployed while serving on active federal military duty;

14 (13) the Texas Iraqi Campaign Medal, which shall be 15 awarded to a service member who was inducted into federal service 16 from the Texas National Guard, without regard to the place that the 17 service member was deployed while serving on active federal 18 military duty, after:

19 (A) March 19, 2003, in support of Operation Iraqi20 Freedom; or

(B) August 31, 2010, in support of Operation NewDawn; and

(14) the Texas Afghanistan Campaign Medal, which shall be awarded to a service member who was inducted into federal service from the Texas National Guard after October 6, 2001, in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, without regard to the place that the service member was deployed while serving on active federal

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1 military duty.

2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
