## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-18 relating to the criteria for awarding the Texas Purple Heart Medal 1-19 to members of the armed forces wounded or killed at Fort Hood on 1-20 November 5, 2009. 1-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Section 437.355(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 1-24

if delegated the (a) The governor or adjutant general, 1-25 authority, may adopt policies and regulations relating to awarding: 1-26 the Texas Purple Heart Medal, which shall be (1)awarded to a service member who: (A) [7] after September 11, 2001: 1-27 1-28

This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2-63 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
