## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating	to	an	alternative	means	of	payment	of	certain	past	due

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 103, Code of Criminal
- 6 Procedure, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 103. PAYMENT, COLLECTION, AND RECORDKEEPING
- 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 103, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 9 amended by adding Article 103.0025 to read as follows:
- 10 Art. 103.0025. ALTERNATIVE PAYMENT PROCEDURE FOR CERTAIN
- 11 PAST DUE FINES AND COSTS. (a) This article applies to a
- 12 defendant's past due payment on a judgment for a fine and related
- 13 court costs if a capias pro fine has been issued in the case.
- 14 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the court
- 15 may adopt an alternative procedure for collecting a past due
- 16 payment described by Subsection (a). Under the procedure, a peace
- 17 officer who executes a capias pro fine or who is authorized to
- 18 arrest a defendant on other grounds and knows that the defendant
- 19 owes a past due payment described by Subsection (a):
- 20 <u>(1) shall inform the defendant of:</u>
- 21 (A) the possibility of making an immediate
- 22 payment of the fine and related court costs by use of a credit or
- 23 debit card; and

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24 (B) the defendant's available alternatives to

- 1 making an immediate payment; and
- 2 (2) may accept, on behalf of the court, the defendant's
- 3 <u>immediate payment of the fine and related court costs by use of a</u>
- 4 credit or debit card, after which the peace officer may release the
- 5 defendant as appropriate based on the officer's authority for the
- 6 <u>arrest.</u>
- 7 (c) A peace officer accepting a payment under Subsection
- 8 (b)(2) may also accept payment for fees for the issuance and
- 9 execution of the capias pro fine.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
