- 5 SECTION 1. Section 61.0595(d), Education Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (d) The following are not counted for purposes of
- 8 determining whether the student has previously earned the number of
- 9 semester credit hours specified by Subsection (a):
- 10 (1) semester credit hours earned by the student before
- 11 receiving a baccalaureate degree that has previously been awarded
- 12 to the student;
- 13 (2) semester credit hours earned by the student by
- 14 examination or under any other procedure by which credit is earned
- 15 without registering for a course for which tuition is charged;
- 16 (3) credit for a remedial education course, a
- 17 technical course, a workforce education course funded according to
- 18 contact hours, or another course that does not count toward a degree
- 19 program at the institution;
- 20 (4) semester credit hours earned by the student at a
- 21 private institution or an out-of-state institution; [and]
- 22 (5) semester credit hours earned by the student before
- 23 graduating from high school and used to satisfy high school

- 1 (6) not more than 20 semester credit hours earned by
- 2 the student in working toward an associate's degree awarded to the
- 3 student that do not count toward the baccalaureate degree program
- 4 in which the student is enrolled.
- 5 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 6 61.0595, Education Code, applies beginning with the funding
- 7 recommendations made under Section 61.059, Education Code, for the
- 8 2017-2018 academic year.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
