1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the disposition of certain surplus motor vehicles and
 1-20 other law enforcement equipment by the Texas Facilities Commission.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 2175, Government Code, is
 1-23 amended by adding Section 2175.308 to read as follows:

1-24 Sec. 2175.308. EXCEPTION FOR CERTAIN PROPERTY OF DEPARTMENT
 1-25 OF PUBLIC SAFETY. (a) Notwithstanding any conflicting provision
 1-26 of this chapter, if the commission determines that this state's
 1-27 efforts to secure this state's international border and combat
 1-28 transnational crime will sufficiently benefit from the donation of
 1-29 the surplus motor vehicles and other law enforcement equipment of
 1-30 the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas to a municipal
 1-31 or county law enforcement agency in an economically disadvantaged
 1-32 area of this state, the commission may transfer the property to the
 1-33 agency at a price or for other consideration agreed to by the
 1-34 commission and the agency.

1-35 (b) A law enforcement agency that receives surplus property
 1-36 under Subsection (a) may not sell the property before the second
 1-37 anniversary of the date the property is received.

1-38 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
