6	Sec. 38.001. RECOVERY OF ATTORNEY'S FEES. (a) Except as
7	provided by Subsection (b), a [A] person may recover reasonable
8	attorney's fees from an individual <u>, [<del>or</del>] corporation, or other</u>
9	legal entity, in addition to the amount of a valid claim and costs,
10	if the claim is for:
11	<pre>(1) rendered services;</pre>
12	<pre>(2) performed labor;</pre>
13	<pre>(3) furnished material;</pre>
14	(4) freight or express overcharges;
15	(5) lost or damaged freight or express;
16	(6) killed or injured stock;
17	(7) a sworn account; or
18	(8) an oral or written contract.
19	(b) Subsection (a) does not authorize the recovery of
20	attorney's fees from the state, an agency or institution of the
21	state, or a political subdivision of the state. This section does
22	not affect any other statute regarding the recovery of attorney's
23	fees from the state, an agency or institution of the state, or a
24	political subdivision of the state.

1 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 2 to an award of attorney's fees in an action commenced on or after 3 the effective date of this Act. An award of attorney's fees in an 4 action commenced before the effective date of this Act is governed 5 by the law applicable to the award immediately before the effective 6 date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that 7 purpose.
