24	SECTION 2. Section 821.025, Health and Safety Code, is

[Sec.] 821.023 and 821.025, Health and Safety Code) . . . actual costs; 23 24 (C) housing and caring for the animal during its impoundment (Sec. 821.023, Health and Safety Code) . . . actual 25 26 costs; 27 (D) conducting any public sale ordered by the

8 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only 9 to a proceeding commenced under Section 821.023 or 821.025, Health 10 and Safety Code, on or after the effective date of this Act. A 11 proceeding commenced before the effective date of this Act is 12 governed by the law as it existed at the time the proceeding was 13 commenced, and the former law is continued in effect for that 14 purpose.

15 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
