3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 13, Election Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 13.009 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 13.009. ELECTRONIC VOTER REGISTRATION. (a) The
7	secretary of state shall implement a program to allow a person who
8	has a valid driver's license or personal identification card issued
9	in this state to complete a voter registration application over the
10	Internet from the official website of this state and the websites of
11	the secretary of state, the Department of Public Safety, and
12	counties participating in the program.
13	(b) An applicant for electronic voter registration must:
14	(1) attest to the truth of the information provided on
15	the application by affirmatively accepting the information as true;
16	<u>and</u>
17	(2) affirmatively consent to the use of the address
18	and signature on the applicant's driver's license or personal
19	identification card for voter registration purposes.
20	(c) For each application submitted, the program shall
21	require that a digital copy of the applicant's signature be
22	obtained from the Department of Public Safety.
23	(d) An application submitted under this section is
24	considered for all purposes as an application submitted by mail

- 1 <u>under this title.</u>
- 2 (e) The secretary of state shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 3 <u>implement this section</u>, including rules to provide for additional
- 4 security measures necessary to ensure the accuracy and integrity of
- 5 <u>applications submitted electronically.</u>
- 6 (f) The rules adopted under Subsection (e) must require that
- 7 each Internet website through which a person may complete a voter
- 8 registration application include a description of the offense
- 9 described by Section 13.007 in a conspicuous location on the
- 10 website near the place where the person begins or submits the
- 11 application.
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
