8	(c) If a person who is the subject of a protective order is
9	confined or imprisoned on the date the protective order would
10	expire under Subsection (a) or (a-1), or if the protective order
11	would expire not later than the first anniversary of the date the
12	person is released from confinement or imprisonment, the period for
13	which the order is effective is extended, and the order expires on:
14	(1) the first anniversary of the date the person is
15	released from confinement or imprisonment, if the person was
16	sentenced to confinement or imprisonment for more than five years;
17	<u>or</u>
18	(2) the second anniversary of the date the person is
19	released from confinement or imprisonment, if the person was
20	sentenced to confinement or imprisonment for five years or less.
