## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the information in ad valorem tax appraisal records
- 3 that may not be posted on the Internet by an appraisal district.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 25.027, Tax Code, is amended to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 Sec. 25.027. <u>RESTRICTION ON POSTING INFORMATION ON INTERNET</u>
- 8 WEBSITE [REGARDING CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY].
- 9 (a) Information in appraisal records may not be posted on the
- 10 Internet if the information:
- 11 (1) is a photograph, sketch, or floor plan of an
- 12 improvement to real property that is designed primarily for use as a
- 13 human residence; or
- 14 (2) indicates the age of a property owner, including
- 15 information indicating that a property owner is 65 years of age or
- 16 older.
- 17 (b) <u>Subsection (a)(1)</u> [This section] does not apply to an
- 18 aerial photograph that depicts five or more separately owned
- 19 buildings.
- SECTION 2. Not later than the effective date of this Act,
- 21 the chief appraiser for each appraisal district shall ensure that
- 22 information described by Section 25.027(a)(2), Tax Code, as added
- 23 by this Act, that is posted on an Internet website controlled by the
- 24 appraisal district is removed from the website.

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1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
