A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to the creation of a task force to evaluate training
 3 provided to members of a school district board of trustees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 11, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 11.1591 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 11.1591. TASK FORCE ON MEMBER TRAINING. (a) A task
- 8 force is established under this section to evaluate training
- 9 provided to members of a school district board of trustees and the
- 10 effect of that training on developing effective board of trustees
- 11 leadership.

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- 12 (b) The task force shall be composed of members appointed by
- 13 the commissioner. In making appointments, the commissioner shall
- 14 ensure that the task force includes board members, superintendents,
- 15 representatives of regional education service centers involved in
- 16 providing training to board members, a representative of the State
- 17 Board of Education, a representative of the agency, and members of
- 18 the general public.
- 19 (c) A representative of the agency designated by the
- 20 commissioner shall serve as the presiding officer of the task
- 21 force.
- 22 (d) The commissioner shall appoint the members of the task
- 23 force not later than December 1, 2015.
- (e) The presiding officer shall call the initial meeting of

- 1 the task force on or before January 1, 2016. The task force shall
- 2 meet at the times and places that the presiding officer determines
- 3 are appropriate. The task force shall adopt rules necessary to
- 4 fulfill the task force's duties under this section.
- 5 (f) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
- 6 task force.
- 7 (g) The task force shall evaluate whether training
- 8 <u>currently provided to board members:</u>
- 9 (1) enables board members to effectively make
- 10 decisions about school district budgets and other local school
- 11 financial matters;
- 12 (2) clearly delineates board member roles in guiding
- 13 educational policy and promoting student achievement without
- 14 engaging in daily administrative and financial details;
- 15 (3) provides tools for board members,
- 16 superintendents, schools, and the community to create successful
- 17 district-wide initiatives and achieve active parental engagement;
- 18 and
- 19 (4) prepares board members to establish a climate of
- 20 cooperation between the board members and superintendent that
- 21 promotes a caring environment for students while maintaining high
- 22 <u>expectations.</u>
- 23 (h) The task force shall prepare a report that includes:
- 24 (1) a description of the activities of the task force;
- 25 (2) the findings and recommendations of the task
- 26 force, including any proposed policy recommendations; and
- 27 (3) any proposals for legislation or other matters the

- 1 <u>task force considers appropriate.</u>
- 2 (i) Not later than September 1, 2017, the task force shall
- 3 deliver the report required by Subsection (h) to the governor, the
- 4 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 5 and the chair of the State Board of Education.
- 6 (j) The task force is abolished and this section expires
- 7 <u>December 1, 2017.</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
