## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the creation of a task force to determine alternative
- 3 methods of assessing the performance of public school students and

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. TASK FORCE ON ALTERNATIVES TO STANDARDIZED
- 7 TESTING. (a) A task force is established under this section to
- 8 determine alternative methods of assessing the performance of
- 9 public school students and school districts.
- 10 (b) The task force is composed of the following 42 members
- 11 appointed by the commissioner of education:
- 12 (1) 10 teachers who are certified in bilingual
- 13 education with a minimum of three years' classroom experience, with
- 14 appointment reflecting the geographic diversity of the state and
- 15 including teachers from both rural and urban school districts;
- 16 (2) three teachers specializing in language arts with
- 17 a minimum of three years' classroom experience;
- 18 (3) two teachers specializing in mathematics with a
- 19 minimum of three years' classroom experience;
- 20 (4) five teachers with a minimum of three years'
- 21 classroom experience;
- 22 (5) 10 school administrators and school district
- 23 central office administrators, with appointments reflecting the
- 24 geographic diversity of the state; and

- 1 (6) 12 members who are students, parents of students,
- 2 or community members, including university professors and
- 3 education policy researchers.
- 4 (c) The commissioner of education shall appoint the
- 5 presiding officer of the task force.
- 6 (d) The commissioner of education shall appoint the members
- 7 of the task force not later than December 1, 2015.
- 8 (e) The presiding officer shall call the initial meeting of
- 9 the task force on or before January 1, 2016. The task force shall
- 10 meet at the times and places that the presiding officer determines
- 11 are appropriate. The task force shall adopt rules necessary to
- 12 fulfill the task force's duties under this section.
- 13 (f) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
- 14 task force.
- 15 SECTION 2. DUTIES OF TASK FORCE. The task force shall
- 16 evaluate alternative methods of measuring accountability to
- 17 replace standardized testing of students. The task force shall:
- 18 (1) determine alternative methods of measuring
- 19 accountability using multiple forms of evidence of student learning
- 20 and student growth, with information about student learning and
- 21 student growth obtained at the beginning, middle, and end of each
- 22 school year;
- 23 (2) develop an accountability measure that informs
- 24 teachers of the progress of students and provides real-time
- 25 diagnostic information to be used by the teacher;
- 26 (3) recommend a method of accountability that provides
- 27 assistance to teachers that is locally derived and reflects the

- 1 needs of the local district; and
- 2 (4) develop a system that is easy to incorporate and
- 3 streamline into curriculum and provides minimal disruption and
- 4 interruption to student learning.
- 5 SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than February 1, 2018, the
- 6 task force shall deliver a report to the commissioner of education
- 7 detailing the task force's findings and recommendations. The
- 8 report shall be made available on the Texas Education Agency's
- 9 Internet website.
- 10 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. The task force is abolished and this
- 11 Act expires March 1, 2018.
- 12 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 13 1, 2015.
