- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 501, Transportation Code,
- 8 is amended by adding Section 501.008 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 501.008. TITLE FOR AUTOCYCLE. (a) In this section,
- 10 "autocycle" means a motor vehicle, other than a tractor, that is:
- 11 (1) designed to have when propelled not more than
- 12 three wheels on the ground;
- 13 (2) equipped with a steering wheel;
- 14 (3) equipped with seating that does not require the
- 15 operator to straddle or sit astride the seat; and
- 16 (4) manufactured and certified to comply with federal
- 17 safety requirements for a motorcycle.
- 18 (b) For purposes of issuing a title under this chapter, an
- 19 autocycle is considered to be a motorcycle.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 502, Transportation Code,
- 21 is amended by adding Section 502.004 to read as follows:
- 22 <u>Sec. 502.004. REGISTRATION OF AUTOCYCLE.</u> (a) In this
- 23 <u>section</u>, "autocycle" means a motor vehicle, other than a tractor,
- 24 that is:

- 1 (1) designed to have when propelled not more than
- 2 three wheels on the ground;
- 3 (2) equipped with a steering wheel;
- 4 (3) equipped with seating that does not require the
- 5 operator to straddle or sit astride the seat; and
- 6 (4) manufactured and certified to comply with federal
- 7 <u>safety requirements for a motorcycle.</u>
- 8 (b) For purposes of registering a vehicle under this
- 9 chapter, an autocycle is considered to be a motorcycle.
- SECTION 3. Section 521.084, Transportation Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 521.084. CLASS M LICENSE. A Class M driver's license
- 13 authorizes the holder of the license to operate a motorcycle or
- 14 moped as defined by Section 541.201.
- 15 SECTION 4. Section 521.085(b), Transportation Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (b) Subsection (a) does not prohibit a license holder from
- 18 operating a lesser type of vehicle that is a motorcycle described by
- 19 Section 521.001(a)(6-a) or an autocycle as defined by Section
- 20 501.008.
- 21 SECTION 5. Section 545.416, Transportation Code, is amended
- 22 by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 23 (f) For purposes of Subsections (c) and (d), an autocycle as
- 24 defined by Section 501.008 is considered to be a motorcycle.
- 25 SECTION 6. Section 547.617, Transportation Code, is amended
- 26 to read as follows:
- Sec. 547.617. MOTORCYCLE FOOTRESTS AND HANDHOLDS REQUIRED.

- 1 (a) A motorcycle that is designed to carry more than one person
- 2 must be equipped with footrests and handholds for use by the
- 3 passenger.
- 4 (b) This section does not apply to an autocycle as defined
- 5 by Section 501.008 or a motorcycle as defined by Section
- 6 521.001(a)(6-a).
- 7 SECTION 7. Chapter 661, Transportation Code, is amended by
- 8 adding Section 661.0015 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 661.0015. PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR FOR AUTOCYCLE. (a) In
- 10 this section, "autocycle" means a motor vehicle, other than a
- 11 tractor, that is:
- 12 (1) designed to have when propelled not more than
- 13 three wheels on the ground;
- 14 (2) equipped with a steering wheel;
- 15 (3) equipped with seating that does not require the
- 16 operator to straddle or sit astride the seat; and
- 17 (4) manufactured and certified to comply with federal
- 18 safety requirements for a motorcycle.
- 19 (b) For purposes of this chapter, an autocycle is considered
- 20 to be a motorcycle.
- 21 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
