A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to an optometry career program at the University of
3	Houston.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 111, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 111.43 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 111.43. OPTOMETRY CAREER PROGRAM. (a) The university
8	may operate a summer program that prepares highly qualified,
9	economically disadvantaged junior-level, senior-level, and
10	postbaccalaureate students from any public or private institution
11	of higher education for advanced studies and a career in the field
12	of optometry. The program may include:
13	(1) courses in improvement of study skills and
14	Optometry Admission Test preparation courses;
15	(2) a review of selected undergraduate academic
16	courses that are prerequisites for admission to advanced degree
17	programs in optometry;
18	(3) academic courses that are designed to familiarize
19	students with the course work in advanced degree programs in
20	<pre>optometry;</pre>
21	(4) clinical work; and
22	(5) extracurricular activities, including observing
23	professionals in the field of optometry.
24	(b) To the extent practicable, and consistent with the

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purposes of the program, the university shall operate the program 1 in a manner that assists students in obtaining course credit for the 2 3 program from their respective institutions of higher education. 4 (c) The university shall: 5 (1) recruit eligible undergraduate or postbaccalaureate students for admission to the program; 6 7 (2) establish an application process for admitting eligible undergraduate or postbaccalaureate students to the 8 9 program; 10 (3) develop reasonable requirements for admission to 11 the program; 12 (4) monitor the implementation of the program; and (5) assist in developing services, including career 13 counseling, to support and encourage the pursuit of advanced 14 15 studies and careers in the field of optometry. 16 (d) The university may solicit and accept gifts and grants 17 from any public or private source, including a corporation or other entity, to fund a program operated as provided by this section. The 18 19 legislature may appropriate money for the purposes of this section. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
