## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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<b>1</b>	AIN	ACT

- 2 relating to the governance of public institutions of higher
- 3 education in this state.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 51.352, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a), (b), (d), and (e) and adding Subsections
- 7 (a-1), (a-2), (a-3), (a-4), and (a-5) to read as follows:
- 8 (a) It is the policy of this state that the governing boards
- 9 of institutions of higher education, being composed of lay members,
- 10 shall exercise the traditional and time-honored role for such
- 11 boards as their role has evolved in the United States and shall
- 12 constitute the keystone of the governance structure. In this
- 13 regard each governing board shall:
- 14 (1) [<del>is expected to</del>] preserve institutional
- 15 independence and [to] defend each institution's [its] right to
- 16 manage its own affairs through its chosen administrators and
- 17 employees;
- 18 (2) [shall] enhance the public image of each
- 19 institution under its governance;
- 20 (3) [shall] interpret the community to the campus and
- 21 interpret the campus to the community;
- 22 (4) [shall] nurture each institution under its
- 23 governance to the end that each institution achieves its full
- 24 potential within its role and mission; [and]

- 1 (5) [shall] insist on clarity of focus and mission of
- 2 each institution under its governance;
- 3 (6) develop a balanced governing structure designed to
- 4 promote institutional integrity, autonomy, and flexibility of
- 5 operations while maintaining maximum operating efficiency and
- 6 academic excellence; and
- 7 (7) govern institutions with the spirit of integrity
- 8 in all matters, including operating collaboratively with all
- 9 parties in an open and honest manner.
- 10 (a-1) The governing board of an institution of higher
- 11 education shall protect each institution under its governance from
- 12 undue external influence and ensure that the powers and duties of
- 13 the board are not controlled by a minority of its members or by
- 14 organizations or interests that are separate from the board in any
- 15 manner, including through delegation, tradition, or inaction.
- 16 <u>(a-2)</u> The members of the governing board of an institution
- 17 of higher education must remain free from any contractual,
- 18 employment, personal financial, or familial financial interest in
- 19 the institution or institutions under its governance. This
- 20 subsection does not affect the application of other laws regarding
- 21 conflicts of interest to the members.
- 22 <u>(a-3) Each report, recommendation, or vote of the governing</u>
- 23 board of an institution of higher education or of a committee,
- 24 subcommittee, task force, or similar entity reporting to the
- 25 governing board must be made available to the public on the board's
- 26 Internet website not later than the end of the next business day
- 27 after the date of the report, recommendation, or vote.

- (a-4) A member of the governing board of an institution of 1 higher education is prohibited from voting on a budgetary or 2 personnel matter related to system administration or institutions 3 of higher education until the member attends a training program 4 that provides instruction in ethics, conflict-of-interest law, and 5 the role of a governing board in a higher education institution or 6 system and that is conducted by the Texas Higher Education 7 Coordinating Board, by the system office of a university system, or 8 by the office of a governing board that does not govern a university 9 system. A governing board is responsible for maintaining records 10 of each of its members' attendance of a training program described 11 12 by this subsection.
- 13 (a-5) The governing board of a university system may
  14 terminate the employment of an institution's president or other
  15 chief executive officer only after receiving a recommendation to
  16 that effect under Section 51.353(b)(7), but the board is not
  17 required to act on that recommendation.
- (b) The governing board of an institution of higher education shall provide <u>long-term</u> [the] policy direction for each institution of higher education under its <u>governance</u> [management and control].
- (d) <u>Notwithstanding</u> [<del>In addition to</del>] powers and duties specifically granted by this code or other law, each governing board shall:
- (1) <u>after coordinating with the president or other</u>

  26 <u>chief executive officer of the institution and, if applicable, the</u>

  27 chancellor or other chief executive officer of the university

- 1 system and after consulting with the institution's faculty,
- 2 establish and publish, for each institution under its governance,
- 3 <u>long-term</u> [control and management,] goals consistent with the role
- 4 and mission of the institution;
- 5 (2) review and, as necessary, revise those goals at
- 6 least once during each six-year period;
- 7 <u>(3)</u> appoint the chancellor or other chief executive
- 8 officer of the system, if the board governs a university system;
- 9  $\underline{(4)}$  [ $\overline{(3)}$ ] appoint the president or other chief
- 10 executive officer of each institution under the board's governance
- 11 [control and management and evaluate the chief executive officer of
- 12 each component institution and assist the officer in the
- 13 achievement of performance goals];
- 14 (5) to the extent practicable and to ensure maximum
- 15 operating efficiency, direct that communications between the
- 16 governing board of a university system or individual members of
- 17 that board and the employees of an institution under its governance
- 18 be conducted through the system;
- 19 (6) after consulting with the institution's faculty
- 20 and administration,  $[\frac{(4)}{}]$  set campus admission standards
- 21 consistent with the role and mission of the institution and
- 22 considering the admission standards of similar institutions
- 23 nationwide having a similar role and mission, as determined by the
- 24 coordinating board;
- 25 (7) to the extent practicable, develop and implement
- 26 policies and procedures that allow the faculty, staff, and students
- 27 at any institution under the board's governance to be engaged in and

- 1 informed of meetings of the board or of a committee, subcommittee,
- 2 task force, or other similar entity reporting to the board; and
- (8) [(5)] ensure that its formal position on matters
- 4 of importance to the institutions under its governance is made
- 5 clear to the coordinating board when those [such] matters are under
- 6 consideration by the coordinating board.
- 7 (e) Each member of a governing board has the legal
- 8 responsibilities of a fiduciary in the management of funds under
- 9 the control of institutions subject to the board's governance
- 10 [control and management].
- SECTION 2. Section 51.353(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 (b) In addition to other powers and duties provided by this
- 14 code or other law, each system administration shall:
- 15 (1) initiate, monitor, approve, and coordinate
- 16 long-range planning for the system consistent with the goals
- 17 established under Section 51.352(d)(1);
- 18 (2) approve short-range institutional plans for
- 19 operations and expenditures;
- 20 (3) provide to component institutions technical
- 21 assistance such as legal and financial services;
- 22 (4) evaluate each component institution and assist the
- 23 institution in the achievement of performance goals; [and]
- 24 (5) perform such other duties as may be delegated to
- 25 the system administration [it] by the governing board of the [its]
- 26 system;
- 27 (6) in consultation with the governing board of the

- 1 system, evaluate the president or other chief executive officer of
- 2 each component institution and assist the officer in the
- 3 development and achievement of performance goals; and
- 4 (7) if necessary based on the president's or officer's
- 5 performance, recommend to the governing board the termination of
- 6 employment of an institution's president or other chief executive
- 7 <u>officer</u>.
- 8 SECTION 3. Subchapter G, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 51.3545 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 51.3545. EFFECT OF SUBCHAPTER; RELATIONSHIP OF BOARD
- 11 TO INSTITUTIONS. (a) Sections 51.352, 51.353, and 51.354 control
- 12 over any specific provision regarding the powers and duties of a
- 13 governing board of an institution of higher education provided by
- 14 Subtitle C, D, E, F, or G, and any similar provision to the contrary
- 15 <u>in any of those subtitles has no effect.</u>
- 16 (b) The governing board of an institution of higher
- 17 education may not unreasonably or unduly interfere with the
- 18 day-to-day operations of the institutions under its governance.
- SECTION 4. Sections 61.084(a) and (d), Education Code, are
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (a) The board by rule shall establish a training program for
- 22 members of the governing boards of institutions of higher
- 23 education. Each member of a governing board of an institution of
- 24 higher education shall attend, during the member's first year [two
- 25 years] of service as a member of a governing board of an institution
- 26 of higher education, a [at least one] training program under this
- 27 section. A member of a governing board who is required to attend a

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- 1 training program under this section may attend additional training
- 2 programs under this section.
- 3 (d) The content of the instruction at the training program
- 4 shall focus on the official role and duties of the members of
- 5 governing boards and shall provide training in the areas of
- 6 budgeting, policy development, ethics, and governance. Topics
- 7 covered by the training program <u>must</u> [may] include:
- 8 (1) auditing procedures and recent audits of
- 9 institutions of higher education;
- 10 (2) the enabling legislation that creates
- 11 institutions of higher education;
- 12 (3) the role of the governing board at institutions of
- 13 higher education and the relationship between the governing board
- 14 and an institution's administration, faculty and staff, and
- 15 students;
- 16 (4) the mission statements of institutions of higher
- 17 education;
- 18 (5) disciplinary and investigative authority of the
- 19 governing board;
- 20 (6) the requirements of the open meetings law, Chapter
- 21 551, Government Code, and the open records law, Chapter 552,
- 22 Government Code;
- 23 (7) the requirements of conflict of interest laws and
- 24 other laws relating to public officials;
- 25 (8) any applicable ethics policies adopted by
- 26 institutions of higher education or the Texas Ethics Commission;
- 27 (9) the requirements of laws relating to the

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- 1 protection of student information under the Family Educational
- 2 Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g) or any
- 3 other federal or state law relating to the privacy of student
- 4 information; and
- 5 (10)  $[\frac{(9)}{}]$  any other topic relating to higher
- 6 education the board considers important.
- 7 SECTION 5. (a) Section 103.03, Education Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 103.03. BOARD MEMBERS: APPOINTMENT, TERMS, OATH.
- 10 Members of the board shall be appointed by the governor and
- 11 confirmed by the senate. Members hold office for staggered terms of
- 12 six years, with the terms of three members expiring on February 1 of
- 13 <u>each odd-numbered year</u>. Any vacancy that occurs on the board shall
- 14 be filled for the unexpired term by appointment of the governor.
- 15 Each member of the board shall take the constitutional oath of
- 16 office.
- 17 (b) The change in law made by this section does not apply to
- 18 a member of the board of regents of Midwestern State University who
- 19 is serving all or part of a full term of office that begins before
- 20 September 1, 2015. To implement the change in law made by this
- 21 section to Section 103.03, Education Code, the terms of office of
- 22 members of the board that begin in 2016 expire on February 1, 2021,
- 23 the terms of office of members of the board that begin in 2018
- 24 expire on February 1, 2023, and the terms of office of members of
- 25 the board that begin in 2020 expire on February 1, 2025.
- SECTION 6. (a) Section 105.052, Education Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 105.052. TERM OF OFFICE; REMOVAL; VACANCY. The term of
- 2 office of each regent is six years, with the terms of three regents
- 3 expiring on February 1 of each odd-numbered year [every two years].
- 4 Members of the board may be removed from office for inefficiency or
- 5 malfeasance of office. Any vacancy that occurs on the board shall
- 6 be filled by the governor for the unexpired term.
- 7 (b) The change in law made by this section does not apply to
- 8 a member of the board of regents of the University of North Texas
- 9 System who is serving all or part of a full term of office that
- 10 begins before September 1, 2015. To implement the change in law
- 11 made by this section to Section 105.052, Education Code, the terms
- 12 of office of members of the board that begin in 2017 expire on
- 13 February 1, 2023, the terms of office of members of the board that
- 14 begin in 2019 expire on February 1, 2025, and the terms of office of
- 15 members of the board that begin in 2021 expire on February 1, 2027.
- SECTION 7. (a) Section 111.12, Education Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- Sec. 111.12. APPOINTMENTS TO BOARD; TERMS. Members of the
- 19 board are appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of
- 20 the senate. The term of office of each regent shall be six years,
- 21 with the terms of three regents expiring on February 1 of each
- 22 odd-numbered year [except that in making the first appointments the
- 23 governor shall appoint three members for six years, three members
- 24 for four years, and three members for two years]. Any vacancy that
- 25 occurs on the board shall be filled for the unexpired term by
- 26 appointment of the governor.
- (b) The change in law made by this section does not apply to

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- 1 a member of the board of regents of the University of Houston System
- 2 who is serving all or part of a full term of office that begins
- 3 before August 31, 2015. To implement the change in law made by this
- 4 section to Section 111.12, Education Code, the terms of office of
- 5 members of the board that begin in 2015 expire on February 1, 2021,
- 6 the terms of office of members of the board that begin in 2017
- 7 expire on February 1, 2023, and the terms of office of members of
- 8 the board that begin in 2019 expire on February 1, 2025.
- 9 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect August 31, 2015.
