A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to a prohibition on the sale or transfer of certain law 3 enforcement vehicles before removal of certain equipment and 4 insignia.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 2175, Government Code, is 7 amended by adding Section 2175.907 to read as follows:

Sec. 2175.907. SALE OR TRANSFER OF LAW ENFORCEMENT VEHICLE. 8 9 The commission or another state agency, including an agency delegated the authority to dispose of surplus or salvage property 10 under Section 2175.065, may not sell or transfer a marked patrol car 11 12 or other law enforcement motor vehicle to the public unless the state agency first removes any equipment or insignia that could 13 14 mislead a reasonable person to believe that the vehicle is a law enforcement motor vehicle, including any police light, siren, amber 15 warning light, spotlight, grill light, antenna, emblem, outline of 16 an emblem, and emergency vehicle equipment. 17

SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 341, Local Government Ocde, is amended by adding Section 341.9045 to read as follows:

20 <u>Sec. 341.9045.</u> SALE OR TRANSFER OF LAW ENFORCEMENT VEHICLE. 21 <u>A municipality may not sell or transfer a marked patrol car or other</u> 22 <u>municipal law enforcement motor vehicle to the public unless the</u> 23 <u>municipality first removes any equipment or insignia that could</u> 24 <u>mislead a reasonable person to believe that the vehicle is a law</u>

2	warning light, spotlight, grill light, antenna, emblem, outline of
3	an emblem, and emergency vehicle equipment.
4	SECTION 3. Subchapter Z, Chapter 351, Local Government
5	Code, is amended by adding Section 351.905 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 351.905. SALE OR TRANSFER OF LAW ENFORCEMENT VEHICLE.
7	A county may not sell or transfer a marked patrol car or other
8	county law enforcement motor vehicle to the public unless the
9	county first removes any equipment or insignia that could mislead a
10	reasonable person to believe that the vehicle is a law enforcement
11	motor vehicle, including any police light, siren, amber warning
12	light, spotlight, grill light, antenna, emblem, outline of an
13	emblem, and emergency vehicle equipment.
14	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
