A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| 1 | AN ACT |
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| 2 | relating to the re-creation of the Chronic Kidney Disease Task |
| 3 | Force. |
| 4 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 5 | SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Glenda Dawson Act. |
| 6 | SECTION 2. The state finds that the treatment of chronic |
| 7 | kidney disease is a tremendous expense and that the early diagnosis |
| 8 | and effective treatment of chronic kidney disease can prolong lives |
| 9 | and delay the high cost of medical treatment, including dialysis |
| 10 | and transplantation. |
| 11 | SECTION 3. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is |
| 12 | amended by adding Chapter 99 to read as follows: |
| 13 | CHAPTER 99. CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE TASK FORCE |
| 14 | Sec. 99.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: |
| 15 | (1) "Department" means the Department of State Health |
| 16 | Services. |
| 17 | (2) "Task force" means the Chronic Kidney Disease Task |
| 18 | Force. |
| 19 | Sec. 99.002. CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE TASK FORCE. (a) The |
| 20 | Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force is composed of: |
| 21 | (1) 18 members appointed by the governor as follows: |
| 22 | (A) one family practice physician; |
| 23 | (B) one pathologist; |
| 24 | (C) one nephrologist from a nephrology |

| 1 | department of a state medical school; |
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| 2 | (D) one nephrologist in private practice; |
| 3 | (E) one representative from the National Kidney |
| 4 | Foundation; |
| 5 | (F) one representative from the department's |
| 6 | Kidney Health Care Program; |
| 7 | (G) one representative of an insurer that issues |
| 8 | a preferred provider benefit plan or of a health maintenance |
| 9 | organization; |
| 10 | (H) one representative of clinical laboratories; |
| 11 | (I) one representative of private renal care |
| 12 | providers; |
| 13 | (J) one pediatrician in private practice; |
| 14 | (K) one kidney transplant surgeon; |
| 15 | (L) one representative from the Texas Renal |
| 16 | <pre>Coalition;</pre> |
| 17 | (M) one primary care physician; |
| 18 | (N) one licensed and certified renal dietitian; |
| 19 | (O) one certified nephrology nurse; |
| 20 | (P) one representative from a health care system; |
| 21 | (Q) one representative of the Health and Human |
| 22 | Services Commission whose duties involve the state Medicaid |
| 23 | program; and |
| 24 | (R) one end stage renal disease expert; |
| 25 | (2) two members of the senate appointed by the |
| 26 | lieutenant governor; and |
| 27 | (3) two members of the house of representatives |

- 1 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
- 2 (b) The governor shall designate a member of the task force
- 3 to serve as the presiding officer of the task force. The presiding
- 4 officer serves at the will of the governor.
- 5 (c) Appointments to the task force shall be made without
- 6 regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or
- 7 <u>national origin of the appointees.</u>
- 8 Sec. 99.003. DUTIES. The task force shall:
- 9 (1) coordinate implementation of the state's
- 10 cost-effective plan for prevention, early screening, diagnosis,
- 11 and management of chronic kidney disease for the state's population
- 12 through national, state, and local partners; and
- 13 (2) educate health care professionals on the use of
- 14 clinical practice guidelines for screening, detecting, diagnosing,
- 15 treating, and managing chronic kidney disease, its comorbidities,
- 16 and its complications based on the Kidney Disease Outcomes Quality
- 17 Initiative Clinical Practice Guidelines for Chronic Kidney
- 18 Disease.
- 19 Sec. 99.004. REIMBURSEMENT. A member of the task force may
- 20 receive reimbursement for travel expenses as provided by Section
- 21 2110.004, Government Code.
- Sec. 99.005. ASSISTANCE. The department shall provide
- 23 administrative support to the task force, including necessary staff
- 24 and meeting facilities.
- Sec. 99.006. REPORT. Not later than January 1 of each
- 26 even-numbered year, the task force shall submit its findings and
- 27 recommendations to:

- 1 (1) the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of
- 2 the house of representatives; and
- 3 (2) the presiding officers of the appropriate standing
- 4 committees of the legislature with jurisdiction over health issues.
- 5 Sec. 99.007. FUNDING. (a) The task force, through the
- 6 department, may accept gifts and grants from individuals, private
- 7 or public organizations, or federal or local funds to support the
- 8 task force.
- 9 (b) The department shall investigate any potential sources
- 10 of funding from federal grants or programs.
- 11 Sec. 99.008. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Except as
- 12 specifically provided by this chapter, Chapter 2110, Government
- 13 Code, does not apply to the task force.
- 14 Sec. 99.009. TASK FORCE REVIEW AND ABOLISHMENT. (a) The
- 15 department shall review the need for the task force at least once
- 16 every five years.
- 17 (b) If the department determines the task force is no longer
- 18 needed and should be abolished, the department shall publish notice
- 19 of its decision in the Texas Register and on the department's
- 20 Internet website.
- 21 <u>(c)</u> The task force is abolished on the date stated in the
- 22 <u>notice required by Subsection (b).</u>
- SECTION 4. Not later than January 1, 2016, the governor,
- 24 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives
- 25 shall appoint the members to the Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force
- 26 as required by Section 99.002(a), Health and Safety Code, as added
- 27 by this Act.

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1 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
