5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 801, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 801.164 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 801.164. SPECIAL RANGERS. (a) In this section:
8	(1) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on Law
9	Enforcement.
10	(2) "Department" means the Department of Public
11	Safety.

- 12 (b) The director of the department may appoint two special
- rangers who are employed by the board to assist law enforcement 13
- 14 agencies in the investigation of violations of this chapter.
- (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), a special ranger 15 appointed under this section may make arrests and exercise all 16
- authority given peace officers under the Code of Criminal Procedure 17
- when necessary to prevent or abate an offense under this chapter. 18
- (d) A special ranger appointed under this section may not 19
- issue a traffic citation for a violation of Chapter 521, 20
- 21 Transportation Code, or Subtitle C, Title 7, Transportation Code.
- 22 (e) A special ranger appointed under this section is not
- entitled to state benefits normally provided by the state to an 23
- 24 employee that are based on the employee's status as a peace officer.

- 1 <u>(f) A person may not serve as a special ranger under this</u>
- 2 section unless:
- 3 (1) the board submits the person's application for
- 4 appointment and certification as a special ranger to the director
- 5 of the department and to the executive director of the commission;
- 6 (2) the director of the department issues the person a
- 7 <u>certificate of authority to act as a special ranger;</u>
- 8 (3) the executive director of the commission:
- 9 (A) determines that the person meets minimum
- 10 standards required of peace officers by the commission relating to
- 11 competence, reliability, education, training, morality, and
- 12 physical and mental health; and
- 13 (B) issues the person a license as a special
- 14 ranger; and
- 15 (4) the person has met all standards for certification
- 16 as a peace officer by the commission.
- 17 (g) For good cause, the director of the department may
- 18 revoke a certificate of authority issued under this section and the
- 19 executive director of the commission may revoke a license issued
- 20 under this section. Termination of employment with the board, or
- 21 the revocation of a special ranger license, is grounds for the
- 22 automatic revocation of a certificate of authority to act as a
- 23 special ranger.
- 24 (h) All expenses incurred by the granting or revocation of a
- 25 <u>certificate</u> of authority to act as a special ranger under this
- 26 section shall be paid by the board.
- 27 (i) The director of the department and the executive

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- 1 director of the commission may adopt rules necessary for the
- 2 effective administration and performance of the duties and
- 3 responsibilities delegated to the director and executive director
- 4 by this section.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
