A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of an advisory council to research and make
3	recommendations on the use of assessment instruments in public
4	schools.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 39, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Subchapter A to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER A. ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENT ADVISORY COUNCIL
9	Sec. 39.001. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Assessment instrument" means a test required to
11	be adopted or developed under Section 39.023.
12	(2) "Council" means the assessment instrument
13	advisory council.
14	(3) "Design" means the development of content and
15	reliability testing and validation of an assessment instrument.
16	(4) "Funding" means all mechanisms involving the
17	granting, withholding, accumulating, spending, appropriating, or
18	designating of state, federal, and private money, including
19	mechanisms connecting money to student test scores or involving
20	contracting, outsourcing, or other public-private partnerships.
21	Sec. 39.002. ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENT ADVISORY COUNCIL. (a)
22	The assessment instrument advisory council is established to
23	identify strategic priorities for and make recommendations on:
24	(1) the best practices for evidence-centered

1	assessment instrument design and implementation;
2	(2) teacher and administrator training regarding
3	assessment instruments;
4	(3) the proper use of student scores on assessment
5	<pre>instruments;</pre>
6	(4) student preparation for assessment instruments;
7	<u>and</u>
8	(5) the funding of assessment instruments.
9	(b) The council is composed of:
10	(1) the commissioner;
11	(2) the commissioner of higher education;
12	(3) three members appointed by the commissioner who:
13	(A) are educational research or implementation
14	scientists, psychometricians, or assessment experts; and
15	(B) have distinguished experience in
16	evidence-centered assessment instrument design, educational
17	research, or implementation science; and
18	(4) 31 members appointed by the commissioner in the
19	manner described by Subsection (c).
20	(c) In making appointments required by Subsection (b)(4),
21	the commissioner shall appoint one member who is a classroom
22	teacher in a public school from each senate district on the
23	nomination of the senator representing the district.
24	(d) In making nominations under Subsection (c), senators
25	shall nominate persons who have distinguished experience in:
26	(1) developing and implementing public school reform
27	strategies; and

- 1 (2) designing or administering assessment instruments
- 2 or classroom-based assessments or appraisals of student
- 3 performance.
- 4 Sec. 39.003. TERMS. Members of the council serve terms of
- 5 two years and may be reappointed for additional terms.
- 6 Sec. 39.004. PRESIDING OFFICER. The commissioner serves as
- 7 the presiding officer of the council.
- 8 Sec. 39.005. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of
- 9 the council is not entitled to compensation for service on the
- 10 council but is entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary
- 11 expenses incurred in performing council duties.
- 12 Sec. 39.006. COUNCIL STAFF AND COSTS. (a) Except as
- 13 otherwise provided, staff members of the agency, with the
- 14 assistance of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, shall
- 15 provide administrative support for the council.
- 16 (b) Costs of the administrative and operational expenses of
- 17 the council shall be provided by appropriation to the agency for
- 18 that purpose and by gifts, grants, and donations solicited and
- 19 accepted by the agency for that purpose.
- Sec. 39.007. COUNCIL BUSINESS. (a) The commissioner shall
- 21 make reasonable efforts to schedule meetings and other business of
- 22 the council outside the time during which the school districts of
- 23 council members appointed under Section 39.002(b)(4) are providing
- 24 instruction for students.
- 25 (b) Council meetings and other business may, as the
- 26 commissioner considers appropriate to minimize costs and increase
- 27 accessibility, be conducted by or incorporate telephone,

- 1 electronic means, or another manner of remote communication.
- 2 Sec. 39.008. STRATEGIC PLAN. (a) The council shall adopt a
- 3 strategic plan under this subchapter to:
- 4 (1) investigate and evaluate the design,
- 5 implementation, use of student scores, teacher and administrator
- 6 training, and student preparation strategies associated with
- 7 existing assessment_instruments;
- 8 (2) investigate and evaluate funding of existing
- 9 assessment instruments;
- 10 (3) specify strategies for the design and
- 11 implementation of assessment instruments for public schools;
- 12 (4) specify strategies for the use of student scores
- 13 on assessment instruments;
- 14 <u>(5)</u> specify strategies for teacher and administrator
- 15 training associated with assessment instruments;
- 16 (6) specify strategies, including limitations, for
- 17 curricular and procedural student preparation for assessment
- 18 instruments;
- 19 (7) specify strategies for the funding of assessment
- 20 instruments; and
- 21 (8) identify key objectives for appropriate research
- 22 and program evaluation conducted as provided by this subchapter.
- 23 (b) The commissioner and the commissioner of higher
- 24 education shall adopt rules as necessary to administer the
- 25 strategic plan adopted by the council under this section.
- 26 (c) The commissioner and the commissioner of higher
- 27 education shall consider the strategic plan in spending money,

- 1 awarding grants, or entering into contracts in connection with a
- 2 program relating to assessment instruments.
- 3 Sec. 39.009. OUTSIDE CONSULTATION; USE OF FUNDS; GIFTS AND
- 4 GRANTS. (a) The commissioner or the commissioner of higher
- 5 education, as appropriate, and the council may coordinate and
- 6 consult with private and nonprofit entities that have expertise
- 7 related to evidence-centered assessment instruments.
- 8 (b) The commissioner or the commissioner of higher
- 9 education, as appropriate, may expend funds appropriated for
- 10 assessment instruments for the council to fund an investigation,
- 11 evaluation, or other expense related to the development of a
- 12 strategic plan, recommendation, or report under this subchapter.
- 13 (c) The commissioner or the commissioner of higher
- 14 education, as appropriate, may accept gifts, grants, or donations
- 15 to fund an investigation, evaluation, or other expense related to
- 16 the development of a strategic plan, recommendation, or report
- 17 under this subchapter.
- 18 Sec. 39.010. COUNCIL RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) Based on the
- 19 strategic plan adopted under this subchapter, the council shall
- 20 make recommendations to the commissioner or the commissioner of
- 21 higher education, as applicable, for the use of federal and state
- 22 funds appropriated or received for assessment instruments,
- 23 including grants.
- 24 (b) The council shall include recommendations under this
- 25 section for best practices and key elements of proper:
- 26 (1) assessment instrument design;
- 27 (2) assessment instrument implementation;

1	(3) use of student scores on assessment instruments;
2	(4) training initiatives for teachers and
3	administrators associated with assessment instruments;
4	(5) initiatives, including limitations, for
5	curricular and procedural student preparation for assessment
6	<pre>instruments;</pre>
7	(6) funding of assessment instruments; and
8	(7) powers, duties, structure, and future initiatives
9	of the council.
10	(c) The commissioner or the commissioner of higher
11	education, as applicable, shall consider the council's
12	recommendations and based on those recommendations may award grants
13	to school districts, open-enrollment charter schools, institutions
14	of higher education, regional education service centers, and
15	nonprofit organizations to meet the goals of the council's
16	strategic plan, including establishing pilot programs and imposing
17	additional reporting requirements.
18	(d) The commissioner or the commissioner of higher
19	education, as applicable:
20	(1) is not required under this section to allocate
21	funds to a program or initiative recommended by the council; and
22	(2) may not initiate a program funded under this
23	section that does not conform to the recommended use of funds as
24	provided under Subsections (a) and (b).
25	Sec. 39.011. REPORTS. (a) Not later than December 1 of each
26	even-numbered year, the agency shall prepare and deliver a report
27	to the legislature describing any statutory changes the council

- 1 considers appropriate to improve any matter associated with
- 2 <u>assessment instruments.</u>
- 3 (b) The report under Subsection (a) may include
- 4 recommendations intended for release to the United States
- 5 Department of Education or other entities of the federal
- 6 government.
- 7 <u>Sec. 39.012.</u> RULES. The commissioner and the commissioner
- 8 of higher education shall adopt rules as necessary to administer
- 9 this subchapter and any programs under the authority of the
- 10 commissioner or the commissioner of higher education and the
- 11 council under this subchapter.
- 12 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 13 of this Act, the commissioner of education shall appoint members of
- 14 the assessment instrument advisory council as required by Section
- 15 39.002, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
